




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
Project Background

- The City of Fort Worth initiated a study in 2019 called "Transit Moves Fort Worth" to increase transit's role in the overall transportation system.
- The study identified **priority corridors** and recommended **high-capacity transit**.
- East Lancaster Avenue was one of the priority corridors for development and is the highest ridership corridor in the Trinity Metro bus network.























Project Goals & Objectives


Advancing East Lancaster's goal is to develop a plan to increase accessibility and create opportunities for economic development.

The objectives of this plan include:

- Guiding growth and economic development in the corridor \bullet
- Enabling residents, commuters, businesses, and students to benefit from improved accessibility to downtown and the East Lancaster corridor
- Create opportunities to **repurpose** and **redevelop** underutilized \bullet land currently serving single-occupancy vehicles on a 6-lane road

Transit-Oriented Development Plan Objectives

- Benefit existing residents and businesses along the corridor with **new** housing, retail and service options
- Enable residents, commuters, businesses and students to benefit from **improved accessibility** to downtown and the East Lancaster corridor
- Guide growth and economic development in the corridor
- Accommodate a growing population
- Maximize the potential for **mixed-use development** at priority places in the East Lancaster corridor
- Create opportunities to **repurpose and redevelop underutilized land**



What is Transit-Oriented Development (TOD)?

- Places where **development and transit** support each other
- Growing cities, downtowns, neighborhoods, suburbs
- Compact, walkable, mixed-use communities
- Focused hubs for stores, community services, jobs
- New housing
- Heights, activity, density linked to transportation and transit
- High-quality streets, sidewalks and bike routes
- Reduced parking demand

What is a Station Area Type?

Responds to:

- Primary role of the station area within the corridor work, shop, service, live
- How big the area is that shoppers, visitors or workers come from / number that visit
- Level of traffic, size of streets and highways
- Level of transit service and transit interchanges
- Type of development in the surrounding area today
- Intensity of activity today and in the future
- Height and density of future development




What Station Area Types could apply to East Lancaster?

- **1. Downtown Core:** a major mixed-use center, with high density urban living
- **2. Urban Village:** unique mixed-use destinations, with visitors from across Fort Worth
- **3. Corridor Hub:** a corridor focus serving residents, transit riders and passing traffic
- **4. Local Hub:** meeting the needs of local neighborhood residents
- **5. Neighborhood Living:** new housing to meet local needs
- **6. Regional Amenity:** open spaces, recreation, water management
